

EAA of South Africa Young Eagles Pilot Requirements

We appreciate the participation of all pilots in this voluntary program that gives back to a community. The Young Eagles pilot requirements are basic and in-line with what a standard pilot and aircraft owner would conform to, but just to ensure that there is no misunderstanding, please note that we MUST follow these guidelines: in order to fly passengers in the EAA Young Eagles programme:

- Be a current, paid up EAA member, both Chapter and National
- Hold an appropriate current Pilot Licence (NPL, PPL or greater), and have logged at least 400 hours of flight time.
- Possess a current Medical Certificate
- Be current to carry passengers in the aircraft you plan to use (3 take offs and landings in the past 90 days, in the same class or type of aircraft, as applicable in terms of CARs. If a taildragger, the 3 landings must have been full stop landings)
- Complete the appropriate Young Eagles registration form before the flight, to be signed by you and each of your passengers. A parent or legal guardian signature is required for all Young Eagles flights. We will supply this before the event.
- Conduct flights in an aircraft that is in airworthy condition
- Have Aircraft Passenger Liability Insurance for the aircraft used (owned, rented, or borrowed)
- Adhere to all applicable South African Civil Aviation Regulations
- We will provide a guideline for the flight to maximise the benefit for the scholars

We undertake to, as far as possible, to ensure that there is a selection process in place for the scholars to make this an enjoyable activity for all concerned.
